St. Chan met with Council to determine if there were any unresolved or new issues in the Community that need to be addressed. She commented on the quarterly statistical report and some of the challenges the members are addressing during the pandemic. She indicated that the detachment has a new Member, and two are being transferred.

5. REPORTS:

a. ADMINISTRATION REPORT

- The Tax Sale was held on Wednesday, September 16th, 2020. There were 3 properties on the agenda. We received no bids on any of the properties.
- There is one property that has some questionable concerns so the sale of that property has been deferred.
- Another is in very bad condition and will need some decontamination before it can be inspected.
- The third property owner has indicated that he wants to enter into a three year agreement to pay off the taxes and retain the title.
- The campground is very busy. The revenue to date is approximately 14,300.00. The expenses are not much different than previous years. We will need to spend some money on the roads this fall. Gravel has been ordered and some of the

picnic tables need to be replaced.

- We have been approved for the water meter replacement grant. However, it seems that the reason the sewer isn't working to Vilna Foods is that there is a huge mound of calcification at the point that their sewer enters the main. I have applied for the Alberta Stimulus Grant of \$50,000.00 to cover some of the costs related to repairing the main at this point. Should the \$50,000.00 not be enough we may have to shift the Water Meter Funds to cover some of these costs.
- The 49th Avenue Water and Sewer main project is taking longer than expected. It seems the sewer mains were deeper than had originally been estimated. It created a greater degree of elevation. I believe they are anticipating being completed by the end of the week. They will then move to main street, and following that a repair to a manhole at the west end of 52 Avenue that seems to have sluffed.
- .The Utility bills went out last week. There are a few accounts that are seriously behind. I will be chasing them in the next week or two.
- A representative from ATCO Electric was in the Village in August checking the trees that are under or near the power lines. There are seven areas where lines over Village properties will need to be cleared. I have signed authorizations for them.
 - There is a dead birch tree on the north side of the east end of the Trail. One of the residents has asked permission to cut it down for firewood. Permission was granted. I have also granted permission for a resident to take out the deadfall along the ditches as on Village owned property.
- A letter was sent to the County after your last meeting, indicating that the Village is interested in exploring the potential of an amalgamation. They discussed it briefly at their last meeting and it is to be discussed at a future Council meeting. I have forwarded this information to Municipal Affairs. Our file is going to be handled by Roy Bedford. I believe then next step is up to the County.

- In response to COVID-19, the non-residential portion of the June and September 2020 quarterly School Foundation payment has been deferred and will be due in full in December 2020.
- The 2020 School Requisition mill rates and requisitioned amounts have been finalized. As such, the September 2020 invoices are based on the 2020 requisitions and as well will include adjustments related to the March and June 2020 invoices. These adjustments will affect the amount of money we collected through taxes. Hopefully they won't ask for more than we collected.
- We received information that the province was looking for private or not for profit partners who would provide more facilities for long term care services. It was thought that the Vilna Hospital would be an ideal facility for this service. We contacted Michelle Wright and asked her to look into it for us. Upon further research it seems that while our hospital would been an ideal facility, we're not on the list of locations that the province is looking at. Further, although they own the building they were not planning on putting any provincial money into these facilities. We did talk to Loni at the Smoky Lake Foundation. She had also looked into the program and it seems Smoky Lake is not on the proposed location list either. We could have spent a great deal of time and energy on this only to be told, sorry, you're not on the list.

MAYOR CHAPDELAINE'S REPORTS

Evergreen Waste Management - September 16, 2020 ZOOM

- Starting September 1, 2020, Alberta Recycling Management Authority has initiated a pilot project that will increase the types of electronics that will be collected at the waste collection sites, beyond the current scope of materials being accepted.
- Eligible materials for funding under this project include products falling in the following categories:
 - Small Appliances
 - o Audio Visual Equipment
 - o Telecom
 - o Power Tools
 - o Electronic Toy and Musical Instruments
 - o Solar Panels
- The electronics collected under this program will be eligible for the current collection funding rate of \$155.00 per tonne.
- All sites in Smoky Lake County have been inspected, they will be assessed, and make the necessary changes to sites as required to upgrade and accommodate usage.
