May June Council Meetings

In May Council approved the 2019 Budget and Tax Bylaws, and you were issued your Assessment and Tax Notices.

Major projects for 2019 will include

- treatment, maintenance and repairs to the sewage lagoons,
- repair to some sewer mains.
- Geographic Information System (GIS) identifying the municipal infrastructures.
- Fire Hydrant repairs and replacements
- Three old buildings in the Village have been sold and will be seeing renovations:
 - The store referred to as Vilna Foods,
 - The old garage at the corner of 51 St, and 51 Ave.,
 - The Grand Hall.

The **regional water main construction** through the Village is approximately 65% complete. The crews anticipate being completed by summer end.

Lemonade Day, sponsored by Community Futures, brought a couple young children to Main Street on June 22^{nd} . Through the program the children are learning the basics of small business.

Smoky Lake County is hosting a **Youth Fire Camp** for kids for one week in July – 11 youth are participating – Vilna Firefighters Assoc. donated \$1000 to that camp.

The Town of Smoky Lake is requesting the Province to replace **H. A. Kostash School**. Advocacy efforts are ongoing.

There will be no Council Meeting during summer. The next scheduled meeting is September 16, 2019 at 7:00 p.m.

<u>A REMINDER</u> – That recreational vehicles are permitted on Vilna streets only between the Iron Horse Trail and the destination and vice versa. RCMP will be issuing tickets. Also, these vehicles must be licensed

IMPORTANCE OF TREES

With the worldwide concern about greenhouse gas and the excessive generation of Carbon Dioxide, the importance of trees in our communities is vital. But there is one way to reduce your emissions that also makes your property and community more beautiful, improves water quality, and provides numerous economic and social benefits... planting trees!

Trees are Natural Carbon Eaters

Every living thing on Earth is made up of four basic elements - carbon, hydrogen, oxygen and nitrogen. Those four elements make up about 96 percent of your body, and most of a tree's roots, trunk, branches, and leaves.

While we humans get most of our carbon through eating, trees breathe it in the way that we breathe in oxygen.

When a tree breathes, it inhales carbon dioxide and exhales.

oxygen - the exact opposite of humans. As a tree matures, it can consume 48 pounds of carbon dioxide per year (among other greenhouse gases like ozone), and releases enough oxygen for you to breathe for two years!

Removing carbon dioxide from the atmosphere and releasing oxygen in its stead also helps limit climate change providing for a cleaner, healthier climate.

So, by planting trees, you can help clean the air *and* fight climate change! **LET'S PLANT SOME TREES**!!!

Renovations, Construction, Demolition or Replacements

If you are considering renovating your home, building on your lot, demolishing a building or replacing your hot water tank or furnace, keep in mind that most of these activities require a PERMIT. **These are legislated by the Alberta Safety Code and are mandatory when requirements are met.** *Most of the time*, your plumber, gasfitter, or contractor will apply for permits on your behalf, but it's your responsibility to ensure that this is done.

Building, Plumbing, Electrical and Gas Permits can be accessed by visiting the office or going to the Village website at: http://www.vilna.ca/document/library/836/category/2303/Forms-and-Permits/.

The forms are not fillable, so need to be printed and sent to the Inspections Group with the permit fee. *YOU MUST ALSO APPLY TO THE VILLAGE FOR A DEVELOPMENT PERMIT*. The development permit and other forms are online as well. Check at the Village office or with The Inspections Group for the amount of required fees. Some sheds, decks and fences may also require a permit. If you have questions, give us a call.

If you have or are starting a business you require a business license — \$10 at the Village office.

PLEASE ensure you maintain your yard (summer) and sidewalks (winter) - whether you rent or own.

Vilna Transfer Station (dump) is west about a mile west on the north village boundary road #594. Open Tuesday and Saturday 9am to 5pm.

DID YOU KNOW??

In 1925 Vilna settlers were terrorized by hungry wolves driven north from over hunting. One night a group of "merry makers" were pursued for miles (this is in horse and sleigh days!) by a pack of about 20 wolves. This news made it all around North America at the time and for months social affairs were cancelled at night because of the danger of hungry wolf packs. (Sioux City Journal, March 15, 1925)
