<u>COUNCIL NOTES</u>

At a Special Meeting of Council held on Thursday, November 7th, 2019 CAO Loni Leslie tendered her resignation. Loni will be leaving the Village Office in December to take a position with the Smoky

Lake Seniors Foundation. For the past nine years she has expertly guided the Village through an uphill battle to reduce the Village debt while maintaining infrastructure. The debt has been reduced from \$608,000.00 in 2010 to \$112,500.00 in 2019. During this time the Water Treatment Plant was upgraded, we have tied into the regional water line, upgraded the sewage lift station, repaired water and sewer lines and sustained the roads. ALL WITHOUT BORROWING ANY FUNDS. On behalf of Council, thank you Loni for your years of dedication and best of luck in your new endeavor.

COUNCIL MEETINGS

The annual Organizational Meeting was held on October 21, 2019. Leo Chapdelaine was again chosen as Mayor, Don Romanko was appointed as Deputy Mayor and Roy Dyck as Councillor. Following the Organizational Meeting, Council held the Regular October Council Meeting.

The items discussed at the Council Meeting included the possibility of the Smoky Lake Regional Municipalities "twinning" with "Kosiv District of Inano-Frankivsk Region, Ukraine. Alberta Municipal Affairs is requiring that municipalities within a County form Intermunicipal Committees and Boards in order to provide consistency of services and policies, some mandatory and others at the discretion of the participating. The majority of the Council meeting was spent discussing issues brought forward from these committees. They include a

The Federal debt as of the end of October, 2019 is \$755,000,000,000.00. (\$755 Billion). The annual interest payment on this debt is \$26 Billion each year.

PROVINCIAL BUDGET 2019

We elected a Provincial Government with full understanding of the accumulated debt that is hanging over all Abertans. The reported total debt as of November 7th, 2019 is \$66,864,113,500.00 which equates to \$15,482.01 per person. We, the tax payers, are paying \$2 Billion dollars a year in interest payments (that's without paying down any of the principal).

Premier Kenney has announced a budget based on reducing the debt which will reduce the debt repayment and the accumulated interest. BUT, this can't happen without a cost. .

We pay our share of the Federal Debt through Income Tax and GST. We pay our share of the Provincial debt throught Income Tax.

The Municipal debt is paid through your property taxes. The Village currently owes \$112,587.00 with annual interest payments of \$5,261.00 and annual principal payments \$24,075.00.

The Province has announced several cuts that will have a direct affect on municipalities. The Municipal Sustainable Capital grants will be reduced by approximately 15% in 2020 and 20% in 2021. We depend on this contribution in order to maintain our infrastructure. The MSI Grant is project based with a ceiling on the amount eligible.

RURAL CRIME

Council and CAO attended a Town Hall meeting with Minister of Justice, Doug Sweitzer in St.Paul at the end of October. It is no secret that Rural Crime has run rampant in Alberta and that changes to the Justice system are needed. It is recognized that our judicial system needs upgrading and enhancement. They



are hiring more prosecutors, judges and more police officers. They are proposing that victims of crime will have more rights.
