### **COUNCIL NOTES**

2019 is over, and we started 2020 with a water break on New Years Day. The hydrant has been replaced by let's hope this isn't a sign of what the year will be like.

### COUNCIL MEETINGS

The last regular meeting of 2019 was held on December 16th. The business discussed included

- a. Our CAO. Loni Leslie has left us to take on her new position as CAO of the Smoky Lake Seniors Foundation. She will be missed, but Council has hired Debbie Hackman to take over the duties. *Debbie will be starting on January 13th, 2020.* Stop by and introduce yourself.
- b. Sale of property across the highway that used to be the old lagoon sight;
- c. The Seniors' Driveway clearing program was again approved with the rate remaining at \$50.00 for the
- d. A grant application was submitted to do a study on the Village's Storm Water System. The program being used is a regional initiative that will see studies done on water systems, sewer systems, storm sewers and roads and sidewalks.
- e. Community and Regional Economic Support initiative is a grant program that provides Economic Development funding to assist in identifying community opportunities.
- f. Change the next Council meeting date to SATURDAY, JANUARY 18, 2020 AT 2:00 P.M.
- q. The Provincial Government has resolved to eliminate numerous Social programs that are provincially funded and tender these to the private sector, effective March 31, 2020. The funding of the services and programs will be delivered through this system. The Town of Bonnyville has submitted an application to be the administrative Hub for our region and become the Family Resource Network.
- h. Administration presented a draft operating and capital budget to Council for review and ratification. There still are many areas to review before the full budget will be presented to Council prior to the tax season.

#### **RURAL CRIME**

Crime across the province is getting worse. Please be very vigilent. No one seems to be exempt from being a target. People have been experiencing vehicle thefts and break and enters at an astounding rate. Here are a few **Crime** Safety Tips to keep on mind.

- When starting your car, DON'T leave it unlocked while
- Use a door viewer before opening your door. ...
- Always lock up your home before leaving and don't hide your house keys outdoors anywhere.
- Have keys ready and in your hand for immediate use when you return home.
- Use interior and exterior lighting at all times.
- Always use **Safe** Internet Shopping practices.
- Shred credit card offers and bank statements before you throw them away if you do not plan on using them.
- Hide or destroy boxes from expensive purchases.
- Do not answer personal questions about your home such as type of alarm, daytime occupancy, etc.
- Do not give out your personal information or credit card number over the phone unless you initiated the call.
- Above All KEEP YOURSELF AND YOUR FAMILY

Metals seem to be the more common targets that thieves are looking for. They want the catalytic converter off your car, they want the core out of your air conditioning unit and they are steeling tailgates off trucks.

Apart from precious metals like gold and silver, the metals most commonly stolen are nonferrous metals such as copper, aluminum, brass, and bronze. However, even cast iron and steel are seeing higher rates of **theft** due to increased scrap **metal** prices. One defining characteristic of **metal theft** is the motivation.

The surge in thefts is believed to be linked to the soaring value of two of the **metals** used in **catalytic converters**, rhodium and palladium, with gangs stripping the parts and selling them overseas.
