COUNCIL MEETINGS

It's hard to believe that we have gone from shoveling snow to being confined to our homes and now, being allowed to walk around the block as long as we social distance ... all within two months. It actually feels a lot longer than two months. But so far, Vilna has come through the Pandemic with no cases YET.

Let's not let our guard down.

At the April Council meeting Council discussed the COVID-19 Pandemic and the affects it might have on the residents of Vilna.

- The province has mandated that until such time as the COVID-19 emergency is over, municipalities shall allow all delivery trucks to travel on all and any of the streets and roads in order to allow the efficient and necessary delivery of goods.
- Campgrounds that do not provide electricity and water services, and have an on-site manager that will enforce social distancing, shall not open until further notice.

 Although the province has indicated that some campgrounds may be opened for May 14th, we do not have an on-site manager, nor do we have water hook-ups at the sites. This issue will be again discussed at the next Council meeting.
- The Province has mandated that utility services for electricity and natural gas cannot be shut off for non-payment, but the utility user can make arrangements with the service provider. This did not include water, sewer and garbage utilities. However, Council did pass a resolution that would provide assistance to those who are seriously affected by the Pandemic and are struggling financially.

"That deferral of arrears for utilities can be considered if the service client is willing to make deferral payment arrangements, with the understanding that if they default on the payment arrangement, or if they fail to make deferral arrangements, the service shall be disconnected after June 19th, 2020, and remain off until the account is paid in full.

• The Province has put forward a deferral of the education portion of education taxes for commercial and industrial properties for a period of six months, or implement a combined municipal and education property tax deferral that is equivalent to deferring six monthS worth of tax.

Council resolved,

"That a combined municipal and education property tax deferral be implemented for all tax payers with all taxes due and payable on July 31st, 2020 with penalties added on August 1st.

Back Yard Hens Council gave 1st reading to a Bylaw that would allow residents to keep a few hens in their back yards. The regulations require that anyone interested in raising hens must take the provincial course and obtain the certificate applicable to back yard hens.

- Provincial course on "Raising Chickens in Alberta'
- Must obtain a Premises Identification Number from the Province.
- You cannot sell the eggs
- You cannot slaughter the hens in the Village
- The coop must provide specific space per chicken
- The outside run MUST be fenced and separate from the back yard area, the hens shall not be given free run of your yard., etc. etc.

Council will consider 2nd reading at their next meeting. A copy of the draft bylaw may be obtained from the office if you are interested in reviewing and commenting on it.
