COUNCIL NOTES

 At the August 6th meeting, the primary topic of discussion was the possibility of finding a qualified CAO to work in Vilna for the salary that we can afford to pay.

After talking to Municipal Affairs it was suggested that we talk to Smoky Lake County about the option of amalgamation. If the County is interested, Municipal Affairs will provide a grant that will pay for a feasibility study. Depending on the results of the study, Council may choose to proceed with the amalgamation or decide to remain independent. It is important that you are involved in the whole process. Somehow, in spite of COVID, we will get information to you, and find a way for you to express your feelings and opinions.

Amalgamation is considered when 2 or more municipalities believe that they can operate more effectively or efficiently together rather than separately.

If both municipalities agree to look into the option of amalgamation, a proposal must be put forward to Municipal Affairs identifying the process through which the public shall be included. In ordinary circumstances this would be through public meetings.

As the process continues a committee consisting of member of the two Councils shall negotiate terms and conditions that will be most beneficial to both. Municipal Affairs is kept up dated on the progress of the negotiations and the results of the public participation.

Through the course of the study, as well as public participation and negotiations it may turn out the amalgamation is not the most beneficial outcome for each municipality. It may turn out that a form of shared services would be better for both.

You've probably noticed some big equipment on the west end of 49th Avenue. A couple years ago we had all the water lines and sewer lines inspected. There are sections of the lines that are desperately in need of repair or replacement. We have accumulated Capital Grant funds until we have enough to do a section of the project. The water and sewer lines are being replaced. The road will be resurfaced in the following year. It is recommended that the excavations be allowed to settle before resurfacing the roads.

I want to send out a very special vote of appreciation to the teachers and school employees who so enthusiastically and cautiously have invited the children back to school.


