#### **KEEPING OUR COMMUNITY GROWING**

At a time when communities were growing and the provincial economy was strong, the province was very generous with capital grants.

In the 1970's the province, recognizing the struggle that the agriculture industry was feeling, began a grant program for Agricultural Societies to build new multipurpose buildings to help provide recreation and cultural programs in rural Alberta.

It's now 50 years later and the look of rural communities has changed. Farms have grown larger, families have grown smaller, the railways have gone and those buildings that were grant funded in the '70's are in need of maintenance and upgrading. The provincial economy is not as lucrative as it was in the '70's and grants aren't nearly as generous. Utility costs have exploded as have labour costs.

Vilna Ag Society has two of those buildings, the Cultural Centre and the Arena & Curling Rink.

The Ag. Society would appreciate some ideas on how to keep the Curling Rink/Ice Arena viable. Currently they only have one tenant, that being the curling club for 4 months each year.

**Cannabis Consumption Bylaw** You can't sit on a bench on Main Street and drink a beer. Neither can you sit on a bench on Main Street and smoke pot. **Smoking marijuana restrictions** 

are similar to drinking alcohol.

Section 4 of Bylaw 540-18 states:

A person must not smoke, vape or consume cannabis in any public place.

### Smoky Lake RCMP Sgt. Anita Doktor

Crime in rural Alberta is escalating. At a recent meeting with Sgt. Doktor, she was asked for ideas on what can

be done to control crime in our region. She was asked "Is the problem not enough policing or is there a problem with the justice system?" Her reply was quite simple ..."we're catching them...."

"Ensuring that individuals, families, and communities in Canada are safe is a core outcome of the Criminal Justice System. Crime <u>prevention</u> and intervention, which aims to protect individuals, families, and communities, can achieve safety."

If we're going to build a safe community we need to <u>prevent</u> the crime. In order to <u>prevent</u> the crime we need to first eliminate it.

We need to support the RCMP by <u>reporting any</u> activity that you feel is suspicious. Don't just say *"it's too late now, what can the police do?"* They can't do anything if you don't report it. It's possible that they have a record of similar activity, and your information is one more piece in the puzzle. Enough pieces and they can find the culprit or culprits. Let's do our part to make Vilna a safer community.

If you see something happening "now" call **911** If it has already happened but you don't feel safe call **911**. If you see that something has happened and you are not in danger call the non-emergency number **780-656-3691** or if it's during the day call **780-656-3550**.

And if you can't remember those numbers, you can always remember **911**.
