ADMINISTRATION

- We didn't meet the Municipal Affairs 90% margin of collecting current taxes in 2023. We collected 82.83% of current taxes in 2023.
- We have 11 properties that are on the tax recovery auction list this year. Hopefully, with new owners purchasing these properties we can reach the 90% next year.

The other concern noted on the report was that we submitted our financial reports late. I have explained that the bank fraud incident in 2023 along with having to change bank accounts and sending notifications of same delayed getting the books ready for the auditors in time.

PUBLIC WORKS

- The crew is working diligently to make the Village look great. They have a challenge keeping the burdock weed under control.
- They finally received the cold mix for street repairs and will be working on this for a while.

FIRE BANS

The Fire Bans have been reduced to a Fire Restriction. This makes the campers using Bonnie Lake happier.

WATER RESERVOIR

- We are close to going to tender for the contractor. Once we have some solid numbers, we can concentrate fully on the dollars, and how to keep our lending down. AE is posting the tender this week.
- Alberta Transportation is receptive to increasing the loan to match to the increase in • cost. We will apply when tender costs are known.

COMMUNITY STANDARDS

- We have been trying to encourage people to keep their yards neat and attractive. On the whole, while we are seeing more attention, some encouragement is still necessary.
- There is more to the Community Standards Bylaw that just keeping your yard clean. We had to shut down a back yard swimming pool which was deeper than the minimum accepted depth and there was no fencing around it or lid on it.
- We had a couple transport trucks parking on our streets. One of them had broken down and was moved once it was repaired, the other was given notice that our bylaw prohibits any vehicle over 1 ton from parking on any streets.
